Meeting patients where they are

Mobile Health Delivers Hope to Vulnerable Communities



Sara Rowe feels called to serve.

Rowe began working in Mobile Health Outreach Ministries more than 22 years ago. "I learned about Mobile Health and interviewed for a clinic coordinator position," Rowe said. "Immediately I knew I was answering that call. I was immediately drawn to serving the underserved."

Now, as community outreach manager, she manages a dedicated team to deliver healthcare to populations that need it most – but cannot access it because they are uninsured, lack transportation, or do not have a primary care physician.

Mobile Health at Ascension St. Vincent's serves five counties in the region and provides services ranging from medical exams to laboratory services, school physicals and immunizations. The combined services add up to more than \$2.7 million in care delivered across the region – and more than 12,000 visits for those in need of medical care. The work is divided into four ministries:

- The Rural Outreach Ministry serves the families working the agricultural fields of Putnam and St. Johns counties.
- The Urban Outreach Ministry helps the working poor, homeless and families in Duval, Clay and Nassau counties.
- The Pediatric Outreach Ministry touches students attending 23 middle and high schools in Duval County's Full Service Schools and gives them the medical care they need.
- The Senior Outreach Ministry provides medical care and wellness education in underserved senior housing apartments.

"It is particularly meaningful to me when we are able to get to know our patients," Rowe said. "When they begin to share their lives and the hardships they have endured, we are able to understand empathetically."

Those connections can change lives for the better. Rowe remembers an uninsured patient with sepsis and a leg wound who also suffered from diabetes and other chronic conditions. Without insurance, he would not be able to pay for his wound care, IV antibiotic therapy or ongoing lab work.

Mobile Health dispensed multiple medications and adjusted his medication regime to better control his chronic conditions. They also referred him to WeCare, a local network of volunteer providers, for his wound care. The patient is also receiving his IV antibiotic through funds provided by the Good Samaritan fund.

"If not for generous donations that support programs like Mobile Health and the Good Samaritan fund, this patient would not have gotten the care he needed after discharge," Rowe said.

Rowe believes that the donations Mobile Health receives are making a major impact across the region by preventing unnecessary ER visits, keeping children in school and providing a medical home to the uninsured.

"Without our donors, we simply would not exist," Rowe said. "The generosity of others allows us the freedom to care for patients that could not receive care anywhere else."

Helping Stephanie take the next step

Stephanie* came to the hospital with a bone infection in her foot, which unfortunately escalated to a below-the-knee amputation. Soon after surgery, it became clear that Stephanie would have trouble walking. She needed a rolling walker to avoid further complications and to preserve her ability to move around independently.

Stephanie expressed her concerns over not being able to afford a rolling walker. Her mother was already paying for her medication and could not assist further. Through the Good Samaritan Fund, she received the rolling walker for free and can now navigate normal life and complete daily activities. She and her family are deeply grateful to the donors who keep this fund in operation.

Supporting Ben when things got tight

In order to leave the hospital, Ben* needed several weeks' worth of IV antibiotics, at-home nursing care and medical equipment. His IV antibiotics alone would cost \$8,800. Ben told hospital workers he would have to sell his car to pay for the medicine.

Case management workers stepped up and used our Good Samaritan Fund to cover the costs, ensuring Ben could safely leave the hospital and keep his car.

Connecting Meghan to lifesaving care

Meghan* came to the mobile health unit for her first routine mammogram. The scans showed a concerning mass. Our team referred her to a free service provider that performed a diagnostic mammogram. Unfortunately, she was diagnosed with breast cancer.

The biopsy and diagnosis meant Meghan needed life-saving surgery. She received that crucial surgery at our Riverside Campus from volunteer physicians via We Care Jacksonville. Had it not been for our Mobile Health Outreach Ministry, it may have been too late for Meghan. Our collaboration with the community offers uninsured and underinsured people access to health care, which is essential in catching illnesses in early, treatable stages.

Lending a hand to a mother in need

Isabel* recently moved here from Argentina with her daughters. Her eldest, who has developmental disabilities, needed medical prescriptions filled. However, because her daughter was 19 and officially an adult - and Isabel did not have official legal guardianship yet - she could not obtain the prescriptions. While she was completing the process, our Mobile Health Outreach Ministry helped her daughter get the medications she needed.

We also assisted Isabel with her younger children by helping with immunization records and connected the whole family with needed financial resources. Isabel was overjoyed at our ability to help her ensure her daughters would be okay.
